Curriculum

Reading: This month, the students will be reading two stories, Our World in Space: Planets, and The Sun. Students will use text features, identify the main topic, ask and answer questions, compare and contrast two similar stories, and make connections.

Writing: Students will be writing an informative story using a question and answer format. They will be including key facts about planets. Students will be focusing on correct punctuation, capitalization, and using learned spelling patterns correctly.

Word Study: Students will be learning about the vowel digraph ie, igh, ue, ew, ui, oo (moon), the consonant patterns kn, wr, the suffixes -ly, and -ful.

Math: In chapter 18, Multiplication and Division, student will learn about repeated addition, sharing equally, and finding the number of equal groups. In chapter 19, Money, students will recognize and name the coins and identify their values. They will count different combinations of coins, add to find the cost of items and subtract to find the change.





Reading:

Read every day, focus on one of these:

- After reading or listening to a story, practice asking and answering questions related to the story. You can break this task up by reading a page or two and then see what kind of questions you can ask. Your child needs to ask a question that they can find the answer in the book.
- If reading a nonfiction story, can your child tell you the main idea? Ask them what helped them figure out the main idea? What evidence from the story was there to help.
- After reading or listening to a fiction story can your child tell you the central message? The central message is a lesson the character(s) learned. What evidence was in the book that led to the central message?

Math:

Continue to practice addition and subtraction facts to ten.
